### FARM REMINDERS

The season for fall planting of vegetables for fall, winter and the spring marketing in Western Oregon is the fourth regular planting time listed by the experiment station. The first is for planting the seed of early, mardy vegetables, the second of tender vegetables after the disappearance of frost, and the third of vegetables in late summer for fall and winter use.

In late cabbage production the seed strain, soil fertility, good moisture-holding capacity of soil, and protection from injurious insects are listed by the experiment station as factors determining the quality and

### CONSTRUCTIVE POLICY MEANS CONSERVATION

"Conservation of our oil resources" has become a popular slogan. Our leading oil companies are as much in favor of honest conservation which eliminates waste, as anybody, but policies which prevent development are not conservation in the true sense of the word.

A prominent oil man recently said that if the Oil Conservation Commission would see that United States citizens are allowed to acquire and develop oil properties in foreign countries and also see that oil companies receive simple justice at home, true conservation of oil supplies could be brought about in a business-like manner.

This would be a definite and constructive policy which would benefit not the oil companies alone, but the whole nation and the world, through bringing about scientific exploration and development of petroleum resources.

### POTATO INSPECTION PAYS

Oklahoma is following Oregon and is working to standardize the potato industry. In 1924 there was no shipped-out stock inspected, while up to August 1 of this year nearly a thousand cars had been federal-state inspected, and found ready markets outside. Standardization of nearly everything is demanded and it is those who get in early that get reputations and permanent markets. The trouble with farmers is that while they raise the crops they have to depend on someone else to raise the price.—Albany Democrat.

### THE PRODUCERS GOT IT

A third payment of \$20,000,000 has been made by the Western Wheat Pool on account of last year's crop on the prairies. But for the pool that twenty million dollars would have gone, not to the producer of wheat, but to those who handle grain after its production.
