QUALITY AT LOW COST

CHEVROLET

The fleetness of a "human greyhound" recently failed to beat an automobile in a 100-yard dash from a standing start at the Los Angeles coliseum.

A half-dozen four-cylinder cars of different makes had been given acceleration tests in 100-yard dashes. The best time was made by a Chevrolet. Each car ran eight sprints over the distance and the results were averaged. The average time made by the Chevrolet was 10.73 seconds.

Other averages were: 11.13 seconds; 11.19 seconds; 11.28 seconds; 11.58 seconds and 12.54 seconds. The cars which ran second and third were considerably higher in price than the Chevrolet.

After the tests, the question arose as to the relative "pick-up" of the automobile and the human sprinter. A contest was arranged in the coliseum between a Chevrolet and Keith Lloyd, cousin of Harold Lloyd. Keith Lloyd is the champion sprinter of the University of southern California. The Chevrolet was driven by Dick Champion, former Bucknell University track star. The stop watch was held by Dean Cromwell, Lloyd's coach.

At the starting gun Lloyd leaped ahead of the car. He was in full stride before Champion had changed to second gear. The rapidly accelerating car roared after him, however, and caught him at the tape. Coach Cromwell clocked car and sprinter in a dead heat of 10.3 seconds. On comparative figures, had Lloyd sprinted against any of the other five cars he would have won without extending himself. The speed of the Chevrolet car at the finish was 32 miles per hour.

Many inquiries come to the state market agent for growers of certified seed potatoes, and requests have been made to county agents to report such fields in their localities. Outsiders Want to Get In.

Because of the outstanding success of the Pacific Cooperative Wool Growers of Portland, California and Nevada sheep men want to get into the association, and they have asked R. A. Ward, general manager, to its operations and establish a branch in Los Angeles. This Oregon organization is now the largest cooperative wool marketing concern in the United States and the largest marketing association in Oregon. It is an example of efficient management and economy—a building from the ground up.

A Cooperative Marvel.

One of the most remarkable cooperative successes of North America is the Saskatchewan wheat growers' organization of Canada, an organization but a little over two years old, but which has had a lightning-like rise to effectiveness and power, until today its worth to its 50,000 members is \$13,000,000. The wonderful results are due to most efficient management and loyal support of wheat growers. Last year's wheat pools have paid growers \$1.65 per bushel, while those on the outside received \$1.45. But for this powerful organization the growers would have received \$87,000,000 for the crop, whereas they have realized \$100,000,000, or twenty cents per bushel more than they would have received. Nearly every farmer in the great prairie province is now a loyal member of the organization. What Canada has done the Pacific Northwest can do. Farmers will never get very far out of the hole as long as they permit the middlemen and speculators to fix prices for both producer and consumer.
