The Munson interests recently purnased the Pan-American service of combination passenger and cargo hips which operates between New Cork and the east coast of South America. The conecting link lies in he Munson-McCormick line, which s operated jointly between the two ompanies in the intercoastal trade. Thus the line will have strong connections at both ends of its route.
