Mr. Hoover pointed out how the nation has recovered from the effects of the war with unparaileled speed, has almost abolished poverty, has spent additional millions on the education an dbetterment of its children and has found time and means to assist the streken nation of Europe to recover. And this was accomplished at a time when there was a demand throughout the world that governments continue was ownership and war operation of industry in time of peace, "a creeping state of socialism' the secretary declared, against which our nation government turned its face and be gan to "unlock the fetters which, from necessity in time of war we had fastened on individual enterprises and opportunity."

This indeed has been one of the most remarkable accomplishments of post-war American statesman ship. As the Secretary of Com merce further stated, twentieth century socialism has been chal lenged "with a new twentieth century American individualism and we are ready to compare six years experiences in recovery and properlty with every country which has been infected with these policies."

Any such comparison of course will be all in favor of the American Individualistic theory. We have only to turn, of course, to the fate of Russa to get all the data we want on the subject.


