

FARM REMINDERS

Forcing or fattening feeds are harmful to the birds during the breeding season, according to the poultrymen at the college station.

Chicks are not removed from the incubator immediately after hatching by successful Oregon poultrymen. They are allowed time enough to dry off thoroughly before being moved.

Plans to increase the amount of irrigation equipment to be used at the college and experiment station gardens on Kiger island near Corvallis are being made, reports the vegetable gardening department of the state college.
