POINTERS THAT SHOULD HELP THE MERCHANT

Along this line Frank G. Cramer names 20 questions that merchants should answer before they can expect full results from their advertising:

1. Have I a sign that points the way to my store?
2. Does the outside appearance of my store attract favorable attention?
3. Are my windows paying full rent?
4. Do I make my window display talk by use of show cards?
5. Do I price everything on display so my customers can see for themselves?
6. Are my windows well-lighted? Do they attract people to the store after dark?
7. Do I display all of my kindred lines, the many smaller items needed in connection with the larger ones?
8. In my store do I make it easy for my customers to buy? Is it attractive? Is it different or just like it has been for years?
9. Is my store well-lighted; is it one of the bright spots in town?
10. Do my fixtures sell goods for me or are they used merely as storage?
11. Do I have a bargain table and do I change it frequently?
12. My silent partner is the merchandise on my shelves. Is he as active as I expect my clerks to be? Is he on the move or is he a loafer?
13. In my want book do I list the items called for that I do not carry in stock?
14. Do I let people walk out of my store with merchandise without having an equivalent in cash or a definite understanding as to payment?
15. Do I realize that manufacturers advertise to create a demand for my merchandise? Do I take advantage of it?
16. Am I giving my newspaper a chance to get results for me?
17. Do I make my newspaper copy individual? Does it stand out stronger than my competitor's? Do I write the copy myself or do I leave it to the newspaper men?
18. Do I standardize my merchandise and my advertising by using a distinctive mark that will be recognized as mine?
19. Do I talk with my farmer customers at their place of business where they can show me the results of their efforts, or do I always expect them to call on me?
20. Do I know my own business? —Wisconsin Press "Howler."

Weekly County Agent News

C. L. Long, Extension Horticulturist of the Oregon Agricultural College expects to be in Clackamas County, August 9 and 10th. The purpose of Mr. Long's visit is to give demonstrations on the use of sulphur dust for the control of brown rot of prunes.

The "Niagara" Duster Company has agreed to furnish a machine for the demonstrations which will be arranged for at Carus and Estacada. These meetings are in line with the recent marketing meetings held at Corvallis.

The elimination of brown rot is declared by marketing experts to be a forward and important step to improve prunes.

The pear and cherry slug, a greenish brown slimy slug, like larva which skeletonizes the foliage of pear, cherry and some other trees is doing considerable damage to Clackamas County orchards.

This pest is controlled by spraying the infested trees with arsenate of lead at the rate of 2 pounds to 50 gallons of water.

An 4-H Canning club was organized at Estacada with Mrs. F. A. Simms as local leader, and the following members enrolled: Lois Bates, Lois Smith, Carol Yocum, Margaret Nordlund and Esther Simms.

On Sunday, July the thirty-first the Carus Boys' and Girls' Clubs will hold their seventh Annual picnic on the Molall River. There will be several talks, some races, horse shoe pitching contests and of course everyone will swim. At noon will be the big picnic dinner.

Hard boiled eggs are sometimes used to garnish fish in a colorful way. Garnishes that can be eaten are to be preferred for economy.

J. P. Woodie, who came to this country on Christmas morning of '72, came in and had us to advance his date tag another year. Mr. Woodie came on the railroad from San Francisco which had only been opened for about 18 months before and it took them 11 days to make the trip from San Francisco to Portland and he told us many interesting happenings of those days.

Oregon farmers are not behind their brethren in other parts of the United States in the use of electricity on their farms and in their farm houses, reports the experiment station. In Oregon horticulture, elec-

tricity has been used in dehydration of prunes and nuts. The design of dehydrators has been vastly improved in the last few years and the capacity approximately doubled by the recirculation system.
