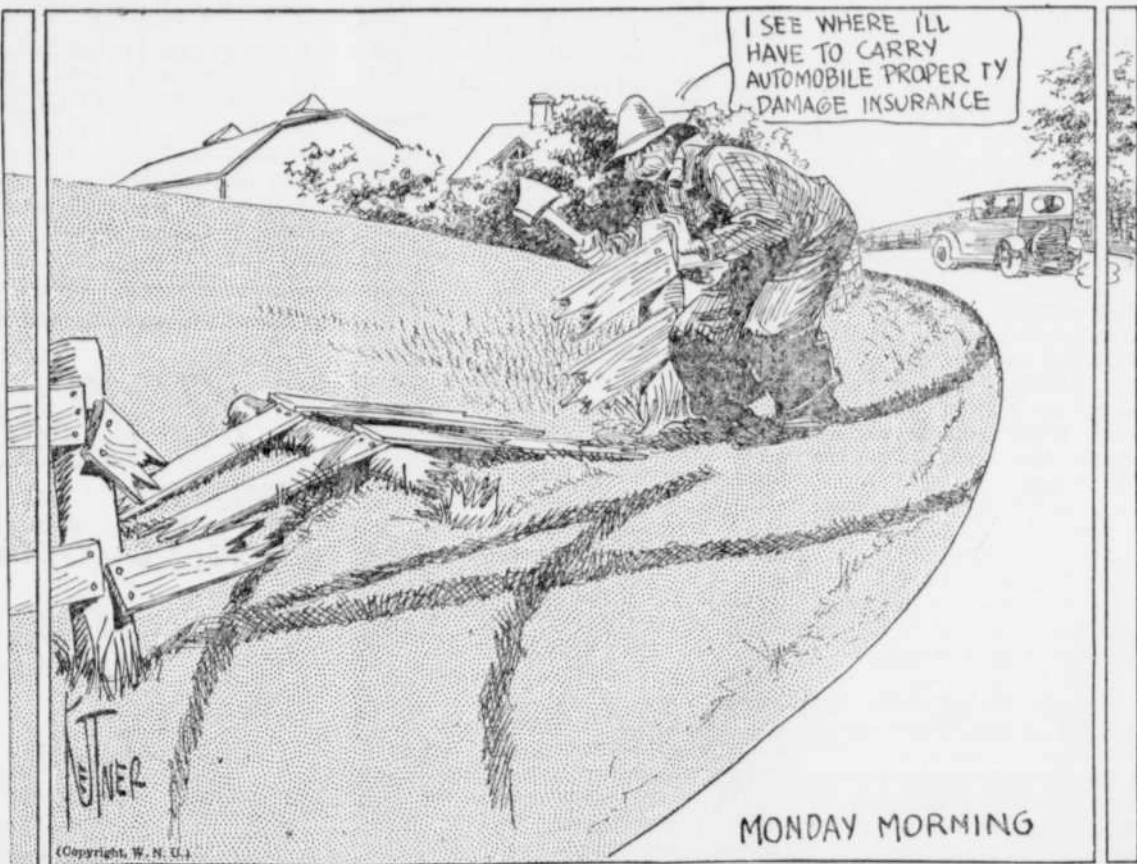

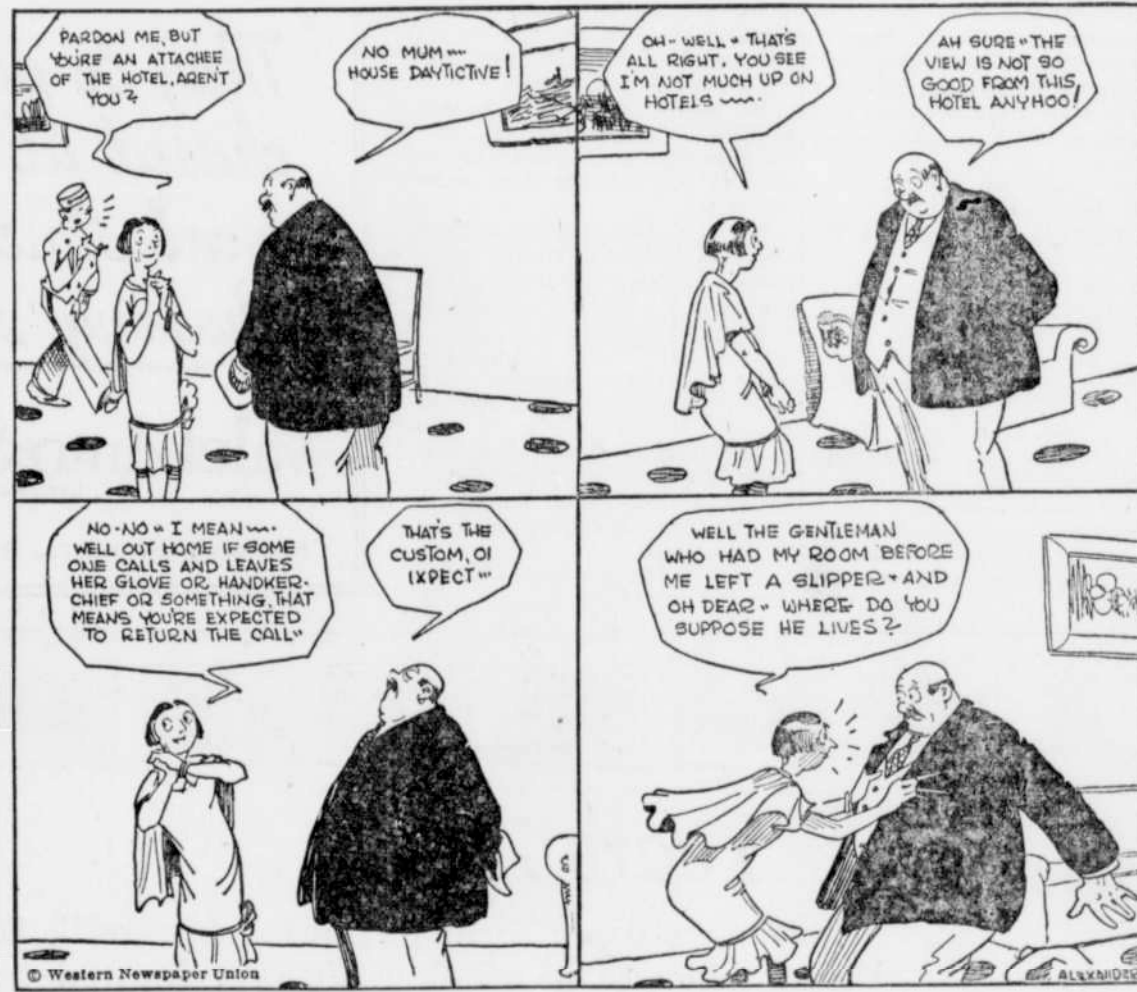

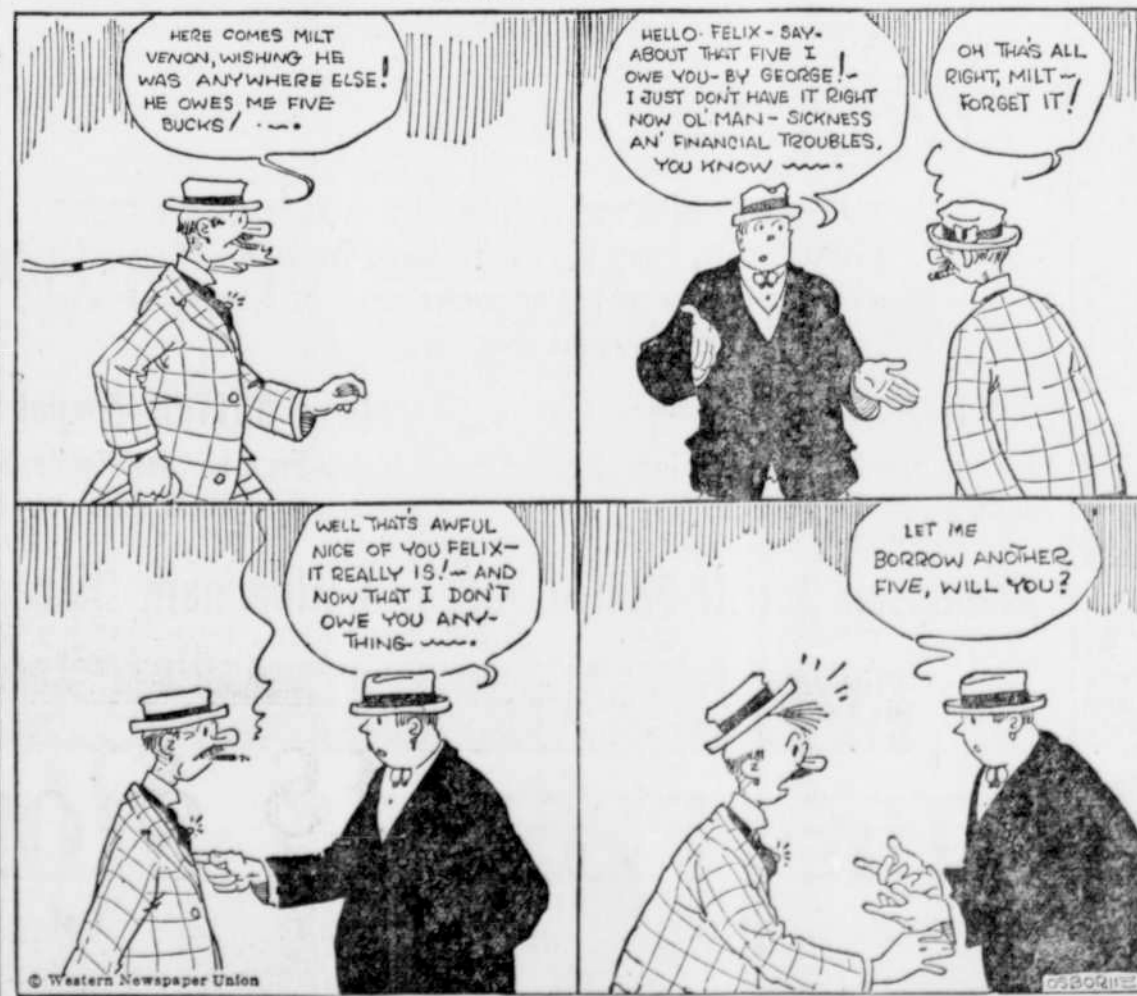

"I left her in the Grand Canyon trying to get the last word with an echo."

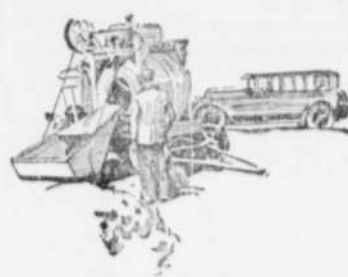

Ancient Hebrew Pottery

The Mispah expedition of the Pacific school of religion has discovered a rich store of Israelite pottery. Prof. William Bade, leader of the expedition, has decided to continue the work of excavation. Near the ancient Semitic temple at Tel-en-anshen two closed cisterns, hewn out of the bed rock, were found by the scientists. The governor of Jerusalem, recognizing the importance of the discovery, accepted an invitation to open the cisterns immediately. They were found to contain many fine specimens of pottery. Several forms of the pottery are entirely new to ceramics in the Near East.
