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Newspapermen to Hold Session in Eugene in January

UNIVERSITY OF OREGON, Eugene.—Extensive plans for the program of the Oregon Newspaper Conference are already being made by Ralph R. Cronise, editor of the Albany Democrat-Herald, who is president of the organization, and other officials. The most interesting session held is assured newspapermen of the state. Dates have been set for January 12, 13 and 14, or the preceding week-end, depending upon what time is best suited for the members.

A new feature this year will be an entire day devoted to daily papers alone. This will probably be the first day. In addition to this, there will be general meetings of interest to all.

On Friday and Saturday of the week special work for the advertising section, printing section, and editorial sections will be held. A program of special interest to publishers of weekly papers will also be arranged, it is stated.

As usual, the Associated Press, United Press and Willamette Valley Franklin club will hold their sessions here at this time.

The usual banquet, which is regarded by newspapermen of Oregon as one of the high spots of the year, will be held and newspapermen will be given plenty of opportunity to mingle with students and see university life first hand during their three-day stay.
