

Notice To Dog Owners

ononononononononononon

Section 9367, Oregon Laws, as amended by the 1925 Legislature reads as follows:-

EVERY PERSON OWNING OR KEEPING A DOG OVER THE AGE OF 8 MONTHS within the State of Oregon shall, NOT LATER THAN MARCH 1 of each year or within 30 days after he becomes the owner or keeper of such dog, procure from the County Clerk of the county in which said person resides a license for such dog, by paying to the county clerk a license fee of \$1.00 for male or spayed bitch dogs and \$2.00 for female dogs. The county clerk shall issue to such person a license and a metal tag, stamped with the year of issue, the name of the county in which it is issued, with a number thereon corresponding to the number on the license. Said ge shall be attached to a collar to be worn by the dog. The said isg shall be for a period of one year from January 1st. ANY PERSON WHO SHALL FAIL TO PROCURE SUCH LICENSE BY LARCH 1st as herein provided shall be required on procurng such ficense TO PAY AS A PENALTY an additional sum of \$1.00 for each male or spayed bitch dog, or \$2.00 for each female dog. The county assessor and his deputies shall forthwith report to the sheriff and the county clerk all dogs that they shall find that are not li-censed as herein provided, together with the owner or keeper thereof. 
