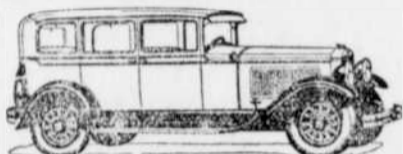

RUBE SHAW'S ROAD SHOW HERE SATURDAY NIGHT

The music by Rube Shaw's famous girl orchestra cannot be excelled, as everyone knows who has ever danced to the strains of their melodies, and as there is an excellent floor in the Masonic hall for dancing, a big crowd is expected to attend the dance after the show.
