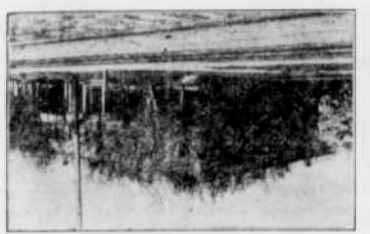
SANDY LOCALS
