COLLEGE LIVESTOCK SPECIALIST TO VISIT CLACKAMAS COUNTY

Harry Lindgren, specialist in livestock, will visit Clackamas county January 25 and 26 to meet with the sheep raisers. He will be assisted in the meetings by Dr. C. H. Seagraves, county veterinarian, and R. L. Clark of the Bodine & Clark commission from Portland.

Meetings have been arranged at Elliott Prairie, Friday, January 25, at 10 a. m., and at the Eagle Creek Grange hall the same day at 2 p. m.

On Saturday, January 26, at 10 a. m., a meeting will be held at Beaver Creek.

The agricultural committees of Eagle Creek Grange and Central Grange at Beaver Creek have charge of local arrangements and everyone is invited.

Mr. Lindgren will talk on sheep management, putting special emphasis on castrating and docking and creep feeding. Dr. Seagraves will discuss diseases of sheep and R. L. Clark will tell of the possibilities of feeding out underweight lambs coming to the Portland market.
