#### Scientists Confer On Codling Moth Control

After careful consideration of tests made with all manner of codling moth traps, new poisons and contact sprays, eight specialists of the Oregon experiment station have agreed that for the present arsenate of lead is still the standard and most certain spray material for this ever present fruit pest.

Powdered form is recommended at a dilution of 4 pounds to 100 gallons for the calyx and early cover sprays, especially in badly infested regions, while 2 pounds to 100 is best for later applications.

Orchard sanitation is strongly recommended as a supplement to the spray program. Material losses can be averted if wormy apples are collected and destroyed at thinning time and if packing houses are screened in the spring to prevent escape of moths into the orchard. Piles of cull fruit that accumulate around packing houses are also sources of many moths.

Cider bait traps developed in the Northwest are being used to advantage as indicators of the flights of moths and hence an index of the best time for spray applications. So far they have not proved an important primary method of control, however. Electric traps caught many other insects but proved unsatisfactory in codling moth control.

Results of extensive trials with chemically treated bands were variable, said Don C. Mote, chief in entomology, who was chairman of the group considering this year's recommendations. More work is to be carried on with these.

Continued experiments will also be carried out with calcium arsenate and fluosilicates. Additional work is also being done with dusts and with contact sprays such as refined oils, oil and nicotine and oil and lead.

Entomologists, chemists, horticulturists and plant pathologists of the home and branch experiment stations took part in the conference. Their recommendations are essentially the same as contained in published spray programs for the year.
