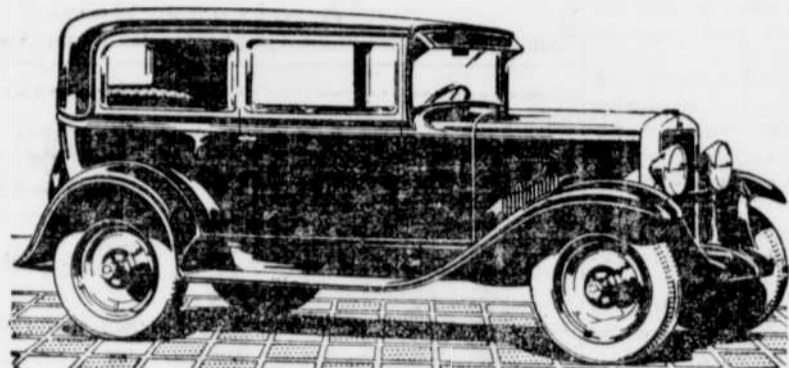
Read This Page Carefully Campaign Ends Forever at 9 p. m. Sat., April 6

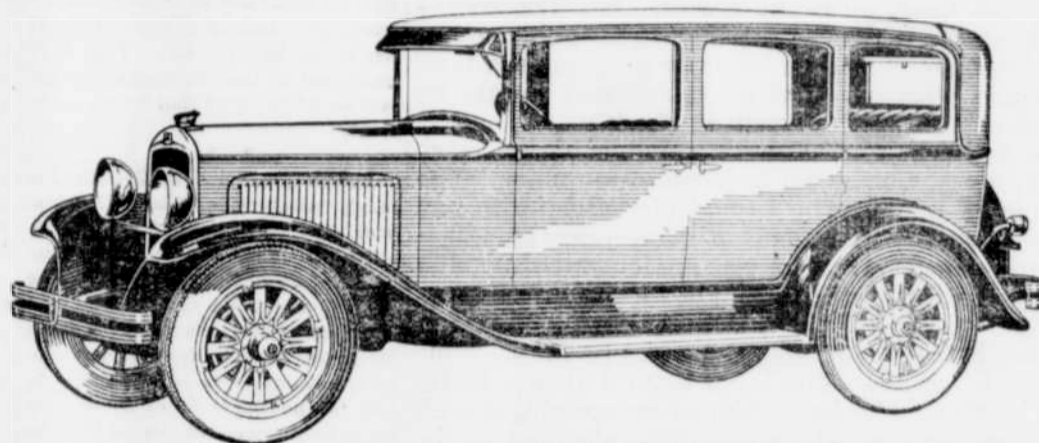

Details of the Final Count

In Order to Maintain the UTMOST SECRECY as to the Numbers of Subscriptions and Votes Turned In By Each Candidate, This, the Last Week of The Clackamas County News Mammoth Free Gift Distribution, the Race Is Being Brought to a Close Under a Sealed Ballot Box System

It is calculated that it will require some time, however, to canvass the findings in the box, and to determine the winnings. The official results will be announced as soon thereafter as possible.

Out-of-Town Candidates, Attention

Heretofore out-of-town candidates have had the privilege of mailing their letters containing subscriptions from the home town as late as the closing hours of the various periods. This will not be permitted the last night of the campaign. ALL VOTES AND SUBSCRIPTIONS MUST BE IN THE SEALED BALLOT BOX WHEN THE RACE IS CLOSED AT 9 O'CLOCK SATURDAY NIGHT, APRIL 6.

Out-of-town candidates should, where possible, arrange to drop their envelopes in person at Bob Marchbank's Confectionery store, in Estacada; but where this cannot be done, letters containing final remittances should be addressed to "CAMPAIGN DEPARTMENT," The Clackamas County News, Estacada, Oregon, and marked "FOR SEALED BALLOT BOX—NOT TO BE OPENED." Particular care should be taken to post these letters so that they will reach this office before the final hour. Use special delivery stamps. Make sure stubs and money check perfectly, and observe the rule printed on this page, which says in part: "PERSONAL CHECKS POSITIVELY WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED IN THE BALLOT BOX."

Sealed Ballot Box

According to the rules of the campaign, the ballot box in The News campaign has been locked and sealed, and placed in Bob Marchbank's Confectionery Store, in Estacada, where it will remain until the closing hour of the campaign—9 p. m., Saturday, April 6. This arrangement will afford the candidates access to the box each day from 8 a. m. until 11 p. m., through the courtesy of Mr. Marchbank. The list of votes published in this issue will remain unchanged to the end except in case of correction of any error that may exist.

Important Notice

All subscriptions deposited in the sealed box must be accompanied by Cash, Money Order, Bank Draft or Certified Check for the full amount to cover. This rule is made in fairness to all candidates, and will be strictly adhered to.

Campaign ends forever on Saturday, April 6, and the two new enclosed cars and other prizes and commissions will be awarded to the best hustlers and most popular candidates.

Judges to Make Awards

Some of the members of the advisory board will be asked to serve as judges to canvass the findings of the ballot box and to award the prizes or gifts. The members of the advisory board, some of whom will act as judges, are named as follows:

- L. A. Chapman, Mayor of Estacada.
- Cecil O. Duke, Clackamas County Bank.
- Dr. W. W. Gilbert, Estacada.
- J. C. Moreland, Garfield.
- R. S. Smith, Mayor of Sandy.

The gentlemen above referred to are well known to everyone in this territory, and two or more from the list will make the final count and canvass the sealed ballot box. The results as determined by this committee will be beyond dispute.

No subscriptions will be accepted through The Clackamas County News campaign department this period, but instead, the candidates themselves will deposit their final collections in the SEALED BALLOT BOX, located at Bob Marchbank's Confectionery Store, in Estacada.

By so doing, no one, not even the publishers or campaign management, can possibly know the voting strength of the respective candidates, which precludes the possibility of favoritism and insures fairness to the minutest degree.

Locked and sealed, the ballot box has been placed in Bob Marchbank's Confectionery Store, in Estacada, where it is available to candidates during business hours. It will be closed promptly at 9 p. m., Saturday, April 6.

When the final hour arrives, the campaign will be declared closed.

The judges will break the seals, unlock the box and immediately thereafter, or as soon as the votes can be issued on the subscriptions there, the last count will begin. The winners will be determined by merely adding the published totals which appear for the last time in today's issue of The Clackamas County News, to reserve votes and those contained in the ballot box. There will be no waiting, no complicated counting, but simply a matter of adding vote totals and announcing the winners.

Every candidate is urged to compare his or her totals with the records of The News. If The News record is not absolutely correct, according to your figures and records, notify the campaign manager immediately, so that proper corrections can be made before Friday evening, April 5. Failure to verify your account before Friday evening will be considered as formal notice of your acceptance of your count as recorded.

Any candidate who does not verify and attest to the correctness of his or her count by Friday evening will be considered as having given notice to the campaign judges and The News office of willingness to accept The News records as the basis of the final count. The judges will secure the final count by adding the votes contained in the ballot box to the records as The News has them.
