THE NEW SPEED LAW

Forty-five miles an hour on the open highway, and even if you drive a little faster, you won't need to have that guilty feeling of violating the law.

Oregon's new highway speed code virtually takes the limit in miles per hour off the motorist and puts the responsibility for the safe operation of his vehicle strictly up to him. The basic rule of the regulation calls for the prudent operation of a motor vehicle, in these words:

"Sec. 20.—No person shall drive a vehicle upon a highway at a speed greater than is reasonable and prudent, having due regard to the traffic, surface and width of the highway and the hazards at intersections and any other conditions then existing."

"The law further provides," says Secretary of State Hal E. Hoss, "that no person shall drive at a speed which is greater than will permit the driver to exercise proper control of the vehicle, and to decrease speed or stop to avoid collision."

"Certain indicated speeds are established in the new law, not as limits in any sense, but as measuring sticks upon which to establish responsibility. The only difference between the responsibilities of a driver involved in an accident at a speed less than those indicated and one who is going faster, are that the penalties are much more severe in the latter case. In other words, when you go faster than the indicated speeds, you are not breaking the law but you are building up a case against yourself. The answer to the question is, that in driving at the higher speeds, one should be extraordinarily careful, and at all times and at all speeds, to be certain of conformity to the basic rule of 'reasonable and prudent' operation of your vehicle."

The indicated speeds are as follows: Open highways, 45 miles per hour; residence districts, public parks and at grade crossings where view is clear, 25 miles; in business districts and when approaching highway intersections, 20 miles; passing schools during recess, or when children are going to and from school, and approaching grade crossings with obstructed view, 15 miles per hour.

Drivers of slow-moving vehicles are required by the new law to let vehicles behind them pass at normal speeds, by drawing over to one side of the road.

A motor bus may travel at a speed not in excess of 45 miles an hour, pneumatic tired trucks not in excess of 35 miles, and solid tired trucks at from 12 to 25 miles per hour, according to the width of its tires. Metal tired vehicles may operate at from 6 to 10 miles an hour, according to total weight.

CHERRY GFLOWERS URGED TO FIGHT INSECT PESTS

Oregon cherry growers are organizing for the most aggressive spring attack against cherry diseases and insect pests ever waged in the state, says H. P. Barsa, plant pathologist of the Oregon State College Experiment Station.

Probably the most important and destructive of the cherry diseases are brown rot and leaf spot, according to Professor Barsa. Together these cost the growers of Western Oregon many thousands of dollars annually and constitute a serious obstacle to the development of a greater and more profitable cherry industry in this section of the country.

Elimination of the sources of infection is the first step in the control of these diseases, and the sooner it is done the better, says Barsa. Brown rot infection lives over winter in the little shriveled cherry mummies and the old blighted blossom clusters still hanging in the trees, and also in the brown, rotted cherry mummies that lie in the soil during the winter and develop spore cups in the spring.

Unless the orchard is too large to make this practicable, Barsa recommends that the growers knock the hanging mummies and old blossoms out of the trees while pruning, and then, before the blossoms are ready to open, plow or disc the ground and then harrow it each week through-

out the blossoming period.

In addition to these measures, spraying and dusting at various times during the season is necessary to keep down the injury from these diseases. For growers wishing information on how to prepare their sprays at home, and when to apply them, two publications, Station Circular 95, "The Chemical Composition of Insecticides and Fungicides," and Extension Bulletin 431, "Orchard Protection Program for Oregon (1931 Revision)," are available from county agents or direct from the college at Corvallis.
