Charter Amendments Submixed to the Voters by the City Council AN ACT

To amend the Charter of the City of Estacada, being an act entitled 'An Act to incorporate the City of Estacada in the County of Clackamas, State of Oregon" filed in the office of the Secretary of State January 31, 1905, and to amend all amendments thereto enacted by the legislative assembly or by vote of the

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEO-PLE OF THE CITY OF ESTACADA, OREGON, that the charter of the City of Estacada, Oregon, being an act entitled "An Act to incorporate the City of Estacada in the County of Clackamas, State of Oregon," filed in the office of the Secretary of State
January 31, 1905, as amended by the
legislative assembly or by vote of
the people be amended by adding
thereto Section 44 to read as fol-

Section 44 (a) For the purpose of procuring funds with which to pur-chase a fire truck and equipment for the City of Estacada, the Council is hereby authorized and empowered to issue and sell bonds of the City of Estacada in the sum of Three Thous-and, Five hundred dollars (\$3,500.00) said bonds to be duly signed by the Mayor and countersigned by the Re-corder, whereby the City of Esta-cada shall be held in substance and effect to untertake and promise to pay the bearer of each of said bonds at maturity thereof the sum named therein, with interest thereon at the rate of not to exceed six per cent (6%) per annum, payable semiannually, each of said bonds to be a direct general obligation of the City of Estacada, Oregon, said bonds to be dated at a convenient time to be be dated at a convenient time to be fixed by the Council, maturity or maturities to be likewise fixed by the Council, but not to exceed twenty (20) years from date, and the principal and interest of said bonds shall be made payable at the office of the City Treasurer, which said bonds shall be known as "City of Estacada Fire Truck Bonds."

(b) The debt limitations contained

(b) The debt limitations contained in the charter of said city shall not apply to the bonds hereby author

(c) The council shall each year as the time of making the annual tax levy for city purposes, include in such levy a sum sufficient to pay in terest on the outstanding bonds of this issue, and to retire the principal thereof as it matures.

News for two (2) consecutive publications within twenty (20) days prior to said election.
