**NOTICE OF SPECIAL ELECTION**

NOTICE is given of a special election called to be held in the City of Estacada on Friday, the 20th day of May, 1938 as in the following resolution provided.

**RESOLUTION**

It is Resolved by the Council of the City of Estacada, Clackamas County, Oregon, that the following proposed amendments to the charter of said City be and the same hereby are proposed for submission to the legal voters of said City for their adoption or rejection at the special city election to be held on the 20th day of May, 1938, as in this resolution provided.

**Charter Amendments Submitted to the Voters by the City Council AN ACT**

To amend the Charter of the City of Estacada, being an act entitled "An Act to incorporate the City of Estacada in the County of Clackamas, State of Oregon" filed in the office of the Secretary of State January 31, 1905, and to amend all amendments thereto enacted by the legislative assembly or by vote of the people.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF ESTACADA, OREGON, that the charter of the City of Estacada, Oregon, being an act entitled "An Act to incorporate the City of Estacada in the County of Clackamas, State of Oregon," filed in the office of the Secretary of State January 31, 1905, as amended by the legislative assembly or by vote of the people be amended by adding thereto Section 44 to read as follows:

Section 44 (a) For the purpose of procuring funds with which to purchase a fire truck and equipment for the City of Estacada, the Council is hereby authorized and empowered to issue and sell bonds of the City of Estacada in the sum of Three Thousand and Five hundred dollars (\$3,500.00) said bonds to be duly signed by the Mayor and countersigned by the Recorder, whereby the City of Estacada shall be held in substance and effect to undertake and promise to pay the bearer of each of said bonds at maturity, with interest thereon at the rate of not to exceed six per cent (6%) per annum, payable semi-annually, each of said bonds to be a direct general obligation of the City of Estacada, Oregon, said bonds to be dated at a convenient time to be fixed by the Council, maturity or maturities to be likewise fixed by the Council, but not to exceed twenty (20) years from date, and the principal and interest of said bonds shall be made payable at the office of the City Treasurer, which said bonds shall be known as "City of Estacada Fire Truck Bonds."

(b) The debt limitations contained in the charter of said city shall not apply to the bonds hereby authorized.

(c) The council shall each year at the time of making the annual tax levy for city purposes, include in such levy a sum sufficient to pay interest on the outstanding bonds of this issue, and to retire the principal thereof as it matures.

RESOLVED FURTHER, that for the hereinabove proposed charter amendment, the following ballot title is adopted, to-wit:

**CHARTER AMENDMENTS**  
Submitted to the Voters by the Council

**AN ACT**  
To Amend the Charter of the City of Estacada by adding a new section thereto, authorizing the council to issue bonds in the amount of \$3,500.00, to provide funds with which to purchase a fire truck and equipment for said city and for a tax levy to pay principal of and interest on said bonds.

RESOLVED FURTHER, that this resolution for proposed charter amendments submitted to the voters by the Council be filed with the Recorder of the City of Estacada for submission to the legal voters of said City at a special election which shall be and hereby is called to be held on the 20th day of May, 1938. The polls for the reception of ballots shall be opened at the hour of eight o'clock A. M. and closed at the hour of eight o'clock P. M. on the aforesaid date.

The following named place is hereby designated as the polling place for said election, and the following named are hereby designated and appointed as and for Judges and Clerks for said election on said date, to-wit:

Polling place: City Hall in said City of Estacada Mae O. Reed, Chairman, Mae J. Culver and Mary D. Smith Judges, and Emma L. Wooster and Dora B. Herring Clerks.

RESOLVED FURTHER, that the Recorder be, and he is hereby instructed and required to publish the hereinabove proposed charter amendments submitted to the legal voters by the Council in the manner required by law; that is to say, by publishing this resolution in Clackamas Co. News for two (2) consecutive publications within twenty (20) days prior to said election.

WHEREAS, it is necessary for the peace, health and safety of the inhabitants of the City that the election hereby called be held at as early a date as possible as the City will obtain federal aid if immediate action is taken; NOW THEREFORE,

AN EMERGENCY IS HEREBY DECLARED TO EXIST, and this resolution shall go into force and effect upon its adoption and approval.

**Soils Tour On May 26th**

Controlling Canada thistle with pasture grasses, the use of ground limestone in growing clover and vetch, grass pastures and the solution of other fundamental problems in the management of red hill soils of Clackamas county will be seen on the annual red hill soils tour to be made on Thursday, May 26. Arrangements for the tour have been made by county agent J. J. Inskip who announces that this tour will start at the four corners at Meadowbrook at 9:30 a.m. Meadowbrook is located on the road from Molino to Colton and is five miles northeast of Molalla.

At the first stop inspection will be made of 60 acres of permanent pasture on 160 acres belonging to Chris Doppleh and located on Woodcock creek. Tourists will then visit the community of Clarkes and see tall meadow oat grass, tall fescue, chewings fescue, crimson clover and superior canary grass on the farms of Clyde Ringo, Ben Elmer and E. E. Berger.

Everyone taking part in the tour is asked to bring a basket lunch. Arrangements will be made for coffee at noon.
