Improvements On Ridge Cemetery

Much work was done at the Sandy Ridge cemetery last week when 17 men and 17 women got busy removing old fences, grubbing, spading, cleaning corners and around graves, and plowing on the west slope for seeding.

The two acre plot was donated by John Fox who also donated the school site adjoining. The first grave was that of D. S. Doyle buried in 1862.

A number of pioneers were buried in the 20's and so many graves are not determined that the Sandy Ridge Women's club and the Deep Creek club, which are sponsoring the work hope to have funds enough to have white markers placed at all un-named graves while old settlers can locate them from memory.

Among the 34 workers were some from Troutdale, Ridgefield, Carson, Portland and outside points who have relatives buried there. The date of May 11 was set for another all-day gathering of those interested. A big potluck dinner was served at the home of Mr. and Mrs. Will Bell.

FILE PETITION TO LEAVE BORING DISTRICT

A petition has been filed with the district boundary board at Oregon City to detach the Haley district from the Boring school district and add the Haley district to the Orient school district. Hearing on the matter has been set for May 24 in Oregon City. If the petition is allowed it will mean a loss of \$1200 school money a year to the Boring district.

Business during the Sandy chamber of commerce dinner Thursday night included the re-appointment of R. S. Smith as the Sandy representative of the Mt. Hood Winter sports association, announcement that arrangements for the free outdoor moving pictures for the summer, starting Wednesday night, June 1 are near completion.
