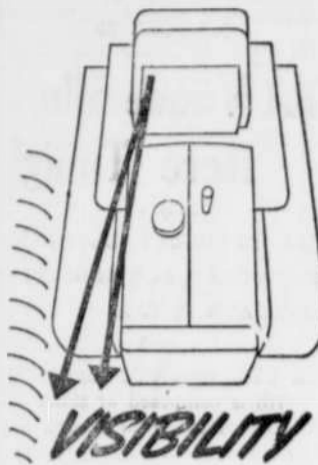

**INCOME TAX AUDITOR COMING TO COUNTY HELP WITH BLANKS**

The state tax commission has announced that an income tax auditor will visit Clackamas county in March to assist income taxpayers in preparing their 1940 income tax returns. He will be in the courthouse at Oregon City on March 17 and 19 inclusive from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. and at the Clackamas county bank, Sandy March 20 from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m.

Every single person (or married and not living with husband or wife) must file a return if his total net income is \$800 or more or if his surtax (intangibles) net income is \$500 or more during the year. Every married couple living together must file a joint return if their combined net income is \$1500 or more or their combined surtax (intangibles) net income is \$800 or more during the year.

Every person or married couple regardless of the amount of their net income from all sources is \$4000 or more. Every partnership and every corporation authorized to do or doing business in Oregon (not specially exempt) must file a return.

Returns for the calendar year 1940 must be filed on or before April 1, 1941 to avoid delinquency charges provided by law.

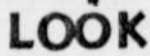
