

### Epic Voyage Made 150 Years Ago

It was exactly 150 years ago the north that Captain George Vancou ver in command of a hardy crew aboard a 408-ton sailing ship appropriately named "The Discovery" set sail from England for the little known and mysterious North Pacific coast.

The many exploratory achievements of Vancouver in this area during the years 1791-1793 are universally recognized today. He discovered and named, either for members of his crew or friends back in England such familiar northwest landmark; as Puget Sound, Mt. Ranies,, Mt. Baker, Whiby Island,, Hood Canal, Vashon Island, Port Townsend, the Gulf of Georgia and many oothers.

One important yet relatively unknown discovery which can be attributed to the Vancouver expedition nowever, was made by Vancouver's ship surgeon and botanist, Archibald land Menzies studiedbotany at the Royal Botanic Gardens,, Edinburgh ater entering the English navy as an, assistant surgeon. Hearing of the proposed expedition to the opposite side of the earth he expressed to Captain Vancouver his desire to accompany it as ship surgeon so he could con-tinue his botanical studies. He was accepted, being later destined to make octanical discoveries equally imporant to the geographical ones of his

Vancouver's tiny ship sailed around the Cape of Good Hope, thence ac ross the Indian ocean, thru the East Indies, and across the broad Parific first sighting the North American continent which was then known a 'New Albion" nearly four months after leaving England. In sailing north along the Pacific coast, Van couver, thru some quirk of fate, failed to discover the mouth of the Columbia river the presence of which was then unknown. However his many later discoveries in the Puget Sound and British Columbia areas

more than recompensed for this over

The expedition proceeded slowly ap the Strait of Juan de Fuca, reputedly named after a legendary Greek Navigator who is said to have been off the heavily wooded coast near the present location of Port Townsend, from where he sent out several smal boats on exploratory trips about the region. One of the boats manned by erew members named Puget and Whid by worked as far south down the island waterway as the present site of the city of Tacoma

During this period of reconnaissance botanist Menzies was busily engaged in exploring the luxurious vegetation which he found ashore. Among the many evergreen trees examwith a giant species which he recog- game commission as the regulations that similar to the Co dars of Lebanon found growing in Asia Minor and to which reference is made in the Bible. Today it is known as Thudja Plicata or Western

Menzies not only noted their distinctive odor, immense size and graceful beauty but he also observed he wide use to which the native Indians of the region, some friendly, some hostile, put this species of wood. They used it for their excellent sea-going canoes, for their everyday camp needs, for their tribal burial coffins, he even saw they took "cedar wool" from the back and wove it On the 5th day of April, 1941 at into primitive blankets. Upon inquiry the hour of 10 A. M., at the front use of this particular tree was its extreme durability and resistence to

At the time Menzies certainly did not foresee the widespread usage which Western Red Cedar would re ceive as a roof and sidewall coverng by millions of his fellowmen who would come to settle in "New Albion" ears later. Wood shingles were used n England however as far back as he middle of the 14th century. The ise of this material was transplant,

ed to America with the Pilgrims. Naturally when the first pioneer ollowed the Lewis and Clark expelition into the Pacific northwest they constructed their homes from the everlasting cedar. With the coming of the transcontinental railroads to he northwest in 1885 the manufac ture of shingles from Western Red Cedar trees sprang into a great industry almost overnight. Today over 4 percent of all wood shingles are nade from this hardy species which grows in commercial quantities in the states of Washington, Oregon and the province of British Columbia.

FROUT FISHERMEN MUST WATCH THEIR STEP

One who goes out fishing these iays will need to carry a copy of the ishingregula ons and a detailed map with him in order to know where he nay cast his line without becoming entangled with the law, or rather, whether or not to indulge in his favorite sport. Many of the streams are losed to all angling while they are supposed to be properly posted with warning signs by the game wardens these signs are often torn down by thotless boys or others or otherwise lestroyed.

In Clackamas county the following streams or parts of streams are closed to all fishing.

All tributaries of the Salmon rivr;; all tributaries of the north fork of the Molalla river; all tributaries to Milk, Clear and Deep creeks; tri-Menzies. Born and educated in Eng- butaries to the Clackamas river; that part of Henry Creek, tributary of Zig Zag river from Henry Creek avenue in Rhododendron to the source of said stream; that part of Sandy river at Marmot dam to its confluence with Frances Dale creek a distance of approximately 4000 feet.


