Music is the one common language thru which we can best express and best advance our common aspirations and promote the spirit of unity.

No one would deny that there are many conflicting interests even among the nation of this rapidly shrinking world which are amicably disposed, or that there is need for us all to use our best efforts to adjust our differences. The problem is greater and the solution more urgent when at present some nations are frankly belligerent and resort to force. The means they present has naturally absorbed our utterance for we must be prepared to meet force with force. But the end is disaster for all. The only permanent hope of civilization human progress and the enrichment of life lies in the opposite direction. And it is in this constructive promising, opposite direction we must look also.

Should we not give a larger percentage of our thought to the exploration of our common interests and to ways and means for furthering these? Such a program has much to recommend it and nothing could be even in the slightest degree detrimental. It must appeal especially to all of us in this hemisphere at this time for common interests whether or not we are conscious of them. We should earnestly seek out these interests and together advance them so they may contribute in the fullest measure to our national and individual lives. Joint participation in cultural enjoyment is an inviting avenue of approach and music is the most friendly means of inter-communication. As inter-American Music week surely has much to recommend it should meet with widespread favor and may well prove a stimulus to a cooperative spirit in other fields.

CHRYSLER OPERATES OWN PLASTIC PLANT

Motorists have been impressed by

the wide variety of color and modulation in colors available in the plastic decorations of the 1941 Chryslers.

The reason for this almost unlimited choice of plastic decorative shades is that the Chrysler sales division has for the past two years maintained its own plastic department, where all plastic objects used in the interior of the body are made and where the various color combinations are carefully worked out.

Under the direction of John A. Koons supervisor, 50 or 60 men produce plastic pieces at the rate of 25,000 a day when the plastic plant is running to capacity. The plastic department is one of the most interesting manufacturing operations in the entire Chrysler plant as the entire subject is new and due for great development.

Heat and pressure are the basic principles of plastic moulding. Heat is needed to reduce the plastic material to the consistency of chewing gum and enormous pressures, running to more than 200 tons are needed to

force this material into the proper shape.

At Chrysler all of the interior plastic decorations at the present time are made of Tenite which in turn is produced from cotton linters and wood fibers. This Tenite is received in the factory in granular form some what resembles coarse salt, said Mr. W. A. Hessel of the Hessel Implement company at Gresham, local Chrysler dealers.
