

MUSIC DIRECTOR RESIGNS

Cecil Bates director of Sandy union high school band and orchestra for about six years has resigned and with Mrs. Bates will leave July 1 for Lebanon where he has accepted a like position. Bates built up an exceptionally fine high school band here which won a place in the north west regional contest at Spokane this spring and had an outstanding grade school band. A successor has not yet been elected.

Victor Bodley will run against the incumbent E. F. Bruns for a five-year term as director of the Sandy union high school district at the annual school election to be held on Monday, June 23rd. The election will be from 2 to 7 p.m. on that day.

WATCH FOR PARACHUTES

If you find a medium sized parachute colored red in your backyard don't get excited.

The chances are well over 10,000

to 1 that it's not the calling card of one of Hermann Goering's parachute troop playmates.

The chances are immeasurably better however, that it's something to do with the U. S. navy.

The navy sends delicate weather-recording instruments far up into the upper atmosphere as a part of its meteorological studies to facilitate private marine and air travel as well as the movements of its own ships and planes.

After a time these instruments become disengaged from their balloons and fall to earth. That's where the red parachutes come in. They stop the fall, help to keep the recording instruments from being broken.

That isn't all. If you want to earn two dollars and help along the navy's weather researches you should send the parachute you find and the instrument attached to The Supply Office, Naval Air Station, Anacostia, D. C. together with three copies of a letter stating your name and address, the place you found the parachute and the day and hour you found it.

You'll get a check by return mail for two dollars plus your postage expense.

Thru aid of forest ranger Harold Engles of Zigzag the exact crossing used by the Samuel Barlow party on their first overland wagon trip into the Willamette valley have been determined and these will be followed as closely as possible by the modern cowboys. Oregon trail markers placed by the Sandy Pioneer association were of great value in re-locating the route Engles said.

The first run is a few feet east of the Sandy river bridge on the Bull Run road and is near the start of the fourth lap in the seven lap 71-mile event. Due to shifts in the rivers current the original ford a few hundred feet below is now impassable. However the crossing at Zigzag river a quarter mile below Zigzag ranger station will be on the exact sandbars used by the pioneers of a century ago. By using the fords horses and riders will not be exposed to the dangers of auto traffic on the bridges the officials of the sponsoring Clackamas county sheriff's posse points out.

Supervisor A. O. Waha of the Mt. Hood national forest is having special maps of the race route prepared for distribution to competing riders so that they may run their horses over the exact stretches of trail that they will run in the race itself.

Central Oregon Sets up Wall Against Spud Rot

A united stand by central Oregon potato growers against invasion of bacterial ring rot has resulted recently in a three-county quarantine excluding all outside potatoes except under definite restrictions reports G. Y. Hagglund, Deschutes county agent. Groups of growers thruout Crook, Deschutes and Jefferson counties urged adoption of the measure and one store has already been convicted for violation of the quarantine.

G. R. Hyslop head of the plant industries division at Oregon state college was in the area some weeks ago instructing inspector and county agents in the fluorescent light method of detecting ring rot. Arrangements have been made for storing local potatoes to insure an uninterrupted supply.
