Sheep Like Broome Grass Hay; Spurn Reed Canary

Smooth broome grass hay proved the most palatable to sheep and Reed Canary grass the least palatable among 19 different kinds of grass and grain hays fed at the Eastern Oregon experiment station reports D. E. Richards superintendent. The test was made by giving five different kinds of hay to sheep each day and then keeping a close check on the amount of each kind consumed. This was the second trial of its kind made at the station and results obtained were similar to those of a year ago.

Smooth broome grass proved to be almost as palatable as alfalfa hay. Other high ranking roughages were timothy, beardless wheat, big bluegrass, Asiatic sanfain and Blueway strains of crested wheat grass.

SANDY LOAN FIRM and UNITS ARE NO MORE

Building New Logging Road

The first access road ever made into the Little Sandy river area will soon be completed and the first bridge ever built across the stream is under construction at Aschoff's butte. The road is being built by the Jarl-Kock Logging company whose trucks will be the first traffic of any kind to roll along between the two Sandy rivers. This new artery crosses North mountain north of Brightwood and is approximately eight miles long on an air line.

The Little Sandy heads at Hickman's butte not far from where the Big Sandy heads and the two streams run almost parallel all the way down

the mountainside from Sandy canyon on Mt. Hood, the Little Sandy emptying into Bull Run river a little above the power plant.

Jarl and Kock have builded this road to give an outlet for timber on the north side of North mountain. It taps a government forest belt otherwise inaccessible. Logging is already starting near the river. The new road will connect with the county artery at Bull Run. Undoubtedly this road, well graded, well rocked, will eventually be used as a forest road. It would also serve well as a county artery were it not located in the watershed, where the public is not invited.

CHRISTIAN SCIENCE CHURCHES

"SACRAMENT" was the subject of the Lesson-Sermon in all Churches of Christ, Scientist, on Sunday, July 13.
