**Sales of Inoculation for  
Legumes top Record**

An all-time high for the sales of  
legume inoculation for one month  
was reported in September by G. V.  
Copson head of the department of  
bacteriology at Oregon state college.  
With the increase in winter cover  
crop seed the demand for vetch in-  
oculant soared to the point where  
enough was ordered in one month

to treat 54,000 pounds of seed.  
The rapid increase in popularity  
of subterranea clover is also indi-  
cated by orders for enough inocula-  
tion to treat 27,000 pounds of seed.

Orders were also placed for the rare  
inoculation for two strains of lotus,  
inoculant for which is now available  
only at the Oregon and New York  
experiment stations.
