**Local Girls May Compete
For Rose Parade Crown**

A week's expense-paid vacation in Hollywood and a chance to ride a spectacular float in the 1956 Tournament of Roses Parade—that's the opportunity offered to all single girls in this area in a current contest for America's "Queen of Liberty."

Finalists from various parts of the country will be flown to Hollywood, view the Rose Parade and Rose Bowl football classic on January 2, and enjoy a week's whirl in the film capital, visiting movie studios and glamorous night spots.

They will compete for the "Queen of Liberty" crown on Jack Bailey's "Queen For A Day" show of December 29, broadcast nationally over the Mutual radio network.

The winner will ride a lavish float in the nationally telecast Rose Parade, accompanied by the "Airman of the Year," selected as the most outstanding member of the Air Force enlisted personnel. The Queen will also make numerous radio and television appearances, receive a complete new wardrobe and many other prizes and gifts.

Any single girl may enter the contest by sending an entry blank, obtainable at a local grocery store, together with a photograph of herself to "Queen For A Day," Hollywood 28, California. Deadline for entries is December 18, 1955.

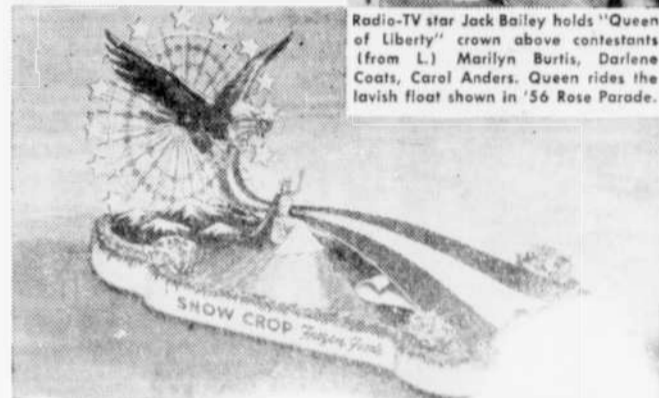
Keyed to the 1956 Rose Parade theme, "Pages from the Ages," the float on which the Queen of Liberty will ride represents one of the most famous documents in history—the Constitution of the United States.

A spectacular creation, 40 feet long, 20 feet wide, and 17 feet high, it is dominated by a soaring American eagle, with a wingspread of 15 feet.

The red, white and blue of the national colors will predominate in the more than 300,000 flowers used to decorate the float.
