The old timer says that years ago a bunch of the "boys" including old Ben, used to come to Estacada for the picture show. One week a comedy was on showing a bevy of shapely girls disrobing for a plunge in the old swimming hole. They had taken off their hats, coats and shoes and were beginning to remove their stockings when a passing freight train dashed across the screen and obscured the view. When the train had passed the girls were frolicking in the water. Later that night when the old timer looked around for his party, Uncle Ben was missing. So the old timer went back to the picture show and sure enough there was Uncle Ben getting ready to see the show thru for the third time. He went in, tapped Ben on the shoulder and said it was "time to go." "That's just to darn bad," said Ben, one of these times that train is going to be late."

If you came to where you thought Coos Junction ought to be you would find it now Winston. The shift took place two or three years ago. Named after one of the most honored and respected family in Douglas County and one of them, Fred, now lives near Estacada where he has gained the standing his kin have in Douglas. The dogs soon had the scent; and followed chase of an hour and a half. Finally the coyote happened too close to Norman who sent a ball from his never-failing rifle straight to the animal's heart. It was a fine shot as the coyote was passing the marksman Noah Stongley who will now have a rival for the best shot around here.

It was stated here two weeks ago that L. E. Belfils was Estacada's first bank cashier. This was an error. Nobody in this department feels like going out on a limb and naming the first one.
