Cheesecake Pie with Apple Sauce Topping



When guests gather for laughter and talk, crown the occasion by bringing out this cheesecake pie. Or when you wish to offer a special treat to the family, trot out this pie. It's a golden, melt-in-the-mouth treat that will be welcome any time.

CHEESECAKE PIE

6-8 Servings

325° preheated oven, 60 minutes

9-inch pie plate

1/4 6-oz. package zwieback

2 tablespoons sugar

1 teaspoon cinnamon

2 tablespoons melted butter

2 cups creamed cottage cheese, sieved

2 eggs

1/2 cup sugar

1/2 cup heavy cream

Few grains salt

2 tablespoons flour

1 teaspoon grated lemon rind

1 tablespoon lemon juice

2 cups canned apple sauce

2 teaspoons grated lemon rind

2 tablespoons lemon juice

1/4 cup chopped almonds

Whole salted almonds

Roll zwieback into fine crumbs with rolling pin. Combine crumbs, 2 tablespoons sugar, cinnamon and melted butter. Mix well. Pack crumb mixture into 9" pie plate. To cottage cheese add eggs, one at a time, beating after each. Add 1/2 cup sugar, cream, salt, flour, 1 teaspoon lemon rind and 1 tablespoon juice. Beat until smooth. Pour into crumb lined pan. Bake in 325° preheated oven for 60 minutes, or until firm. Cool. Combine apple sauce, 2 teaspoons grated lemon rind, 2 tablespoons lemon juice and chopped almonds. Spread on top of cheese filling.
