YOUR SOCIAL SECURITY

Q: My husband owned and operated a cleaning shop from 1940 until June 1954. He became permanently disabled at that time. He is 58 now. Can he receive disability benefits from his social security?

A: One of the requirements is that he work under social security for at least 5 out of the last 10 years immediately before he became disabled. Since your husband's work was not covered by social security until 1951, he would have only four years which we could consider. He would not be eligible for payments.

Q: My wife is 63 but refuses to file a claim for benefits. Can I file for her?

A: Unless she is unable to handle her own funds because of a mental or physical reason, she must file her own claim. Her decision not to file may be well founded if she is aware of the basis for actuarial reduction. There are many factors to consider before filing while under 65, for example, health, life span, income, etc.

Q: I am a laundress. I work for three different employers, one day each week in each home. Should each employer deduct social security tax?

A: Yes. If each employer pays you \$50 in cash wages in a calendar quarter, he should be paying social security tax.
