Picture Your Favorite Rooms

Since so much of the picture taking we do centers around home activities, it's natural for our homes to serve as the background for many of our best snapshots. Today we're suggesting an about-face—how about letting your living room—and the other rooms of your house, too—serve as the subject of your pictures for a change?

There are several good reasons for doing this, especially if you're a "moving" family. Such pictures belong in your family record to help you remember the various places in which you've lived. And, of course, pictures of your home are the next best thing to a visit when they're tucked into your letters to friends and relatives who live too far away for frequent calls.

The really nice part of using your home as a main subject is that you'll have a chance to do a little experimenting. You can try out different compositions and various sources of light. Even if you make a few bluffs the first time, nothing's lost. Just start out again with a fresh roll of film and snap another series of shots. After all, this is one subject that won't move or change position between snaps!

When you shoot interiors, remember that you can't take a whole room in one picture. Study the room in your viewfinder and you'll see it's actually composed of a series of small units. That's just the way you set about arranging it in the first place—sofa and chairs around the fireplace, loveseat and lamp table, built-in cabinets below the wide window, framed prints over the console, wing chair and reading lamp near the bookshelves. Each of these units is a picture in itself—or at least the focal point of interest for a picture.

As for lighting, since this is indoor picture-taking, flash is the simplest choice. But if you want to experiment with flood lamps, here's perfect opportunity to do so. Try softening any deep shadows or dark corners by placing one or two floods outside the camera's field of view. This should distribute the light evenly—which is especially important if you've loaded your camera with color film. Just make sure that your lights don't reflect from mirrors and other shiny surfaces—or you'll get bright glare spots in your picture.
