MEAT COOKERY Quiz

Q. What is the name of this cut of meat?
A. Rolled Beef Rump Pot-Roast.
Q. Where does it come from and how is it identified?
A. It comes from the rump section of the carcass. The rolled rump is made from the standing rump pot-roast; all bones have been removed. The standing rump pot-roast is triangular in shape.
Q. How is it prepared?
A. By braising; a moist heat method of meat cookery. The meat is browned in its own or a small amount of added fat, a small amount of liquid is added, the meat is covered tightly and cooked slowly (simmered) approximately 3 to 4 hours.
