Place the noodles or macaroni in bottom of individual casseroles, a baking dish (7-1/2 x 11-1/2 x 2 inches), or a 2-quart casserole. Spread the cheese over the noodles or macaroni. Top with the browned meat. Combine the tomate soup, water and seasonings; pour over meat. Garnish
