**ALMOST 40,000 BRANDS CHECKED IN 6 MONTHS AT SLAUGHTER PLANTS**

Almost 40,000 head of cattle were inspected at slaughter houses in Oregon during the first six months of 1957, according to state department of agriculture figures. When the full year's figures are compiled, it is estimated that over 100,000 slaughter plant inspections will be recorded for 1957.

It is illegal for slaughterhouse or packing plant operators to permit the slaughter of any livestock until it is inspected by an Oregon brand inspector. The inspections may be made either at the slaughterhouse, at the point of origin or enroute to the plant.

Slaughterhouse operators are also required by Oregon law to keep a copy of the brand inspection certificate of all livestock for a period of one year from the date the certificate was issued.

1 medium onion, chopped	1/8 teaspoon salt
1 pound ground beef	1/8 teaspoon pepper
1/4 pound sharp cheddar cheese, grated	crumbs
	minced parsley, to garnish

Cook the noodles or macaroni in rapidly boiling salted water according to package directions; drain. Heat corn oil in heavy skillet over medium heat about 3 minutes. Add onion and ground beef. Cook, stirring occasionally, until lightly browned. Place the noodles or macaroni in bottom of individual casseroles, a baking dish (7-1/2 x 11-1/2 x 2 inches), or a 2-quart casserole. Spread the cheese over the noodles or macaroni. Top with the browned meat. Combine the tomato soup, water and seasonings; pour over meat. Garnish with the crumbs and minced parsley.
