3000 PEOPLE ARE X-RAYED IN ONE WEEK'S TIME
More than 3000 persons were X-rayed during the third week of the Clackamas County Chest X-ray survey, reports Mrs. A.W. Stout, volunteer survey chairman for the county health department and the county TB association.
The second mobile unit of the Oregon state board of health came into the county to assist in the survey. Mrs. Stout said, which allowed for the increase in numbers over the previous two weeks. The total X-rays taken to date is 3719, she said, with two new cases of active tuberculosis discovered.
In Oregon City Friday and Saturday 589 and 590 persons were X-rayed at the unit on 712 Main street and at Publishers Paper Co. Tuesday and Wed- 261 and 165 employees were X-rayed, making a total of 1695 for Oregon City for the week.
The survey will run through April 12, Mrs. Stout stated, with final days April 11 and 12 at Southgate on 82nd Street. Every adult, of 21 years and over is urged to get a chest X-ray, she said, for it will be sometime before the county has another survey.
YOUR SOCIAL SECURITY
Q: I am self-employed fisherman, but actually work at my business only about five months out of every year. I average about \$4000. Am I credited with a quarter of coverage only in the months that I'm actually working, which means I would only earn two quarters of coverage a year?
A: No. This is not correct. Whenever a self-employed person has a net profit from his business of \$400 or more in a year, he is credited with four quarters of coverage. If he does not have a net profit of at least \$400, he receives no quarters of coverage. Averaging \$4000 as you do, you can be credited with four quarters of coverage each year.
Q: My brother and I operate a furniture store in partnership. If we employed our father, would his wages be subject to social security taxes?
A: No, not if you and your brother are the only two partners. Work by a parent for his son or daughter or by a child under 21 for his parent or by a wife for her husband is not covered by social security. If, however, there was a partner in the business who is a non-relative, then the employment would be covered and subject to social security tax.
Q: As a housewife, I've never worked under social security and will not in the future. My husband is getting his payments. Is it true that the longer I wait after age 62 to apply, the higher my benefits will be?
