HOG PRICES TOO GOOD TO Milwaukie. LAST, BUT FUTURE BRIGHT

Hog profits have been too good to last through the next year, but long-term prospects for Oregon producers are still promising, Oregon State college agricultural economists believe. Highest hog prices in four years-and indications that they

will continue favorable for the rest of 1958, are spurring farm-ers into increasing farrowings in the months ahead, says M. D Thomas, OSC economist. The 1958 fall pig crop is ex-pected to be about 13 percent

larger nationally than in 1957, according to a recent USDA report. Oregon's fall crop is expected to be even higher-20 percent above 1957.

Recent prices of \$25 to \$26 a cwt, at Portland are the highest since 1954. Thomas says this is partly because farmers sold potential breeding stock during the past winter, resulting in a


