**SET DATES FOR ENTRANCE EXAMS.**  
Mt. Angel College has set July 26 and 27 as the summer dates for entrance examinations. Students who wish to enter college in September may take the tests on either of these days. They are slated to begin at 9:30 in the morning and will continue until noon.

During the past school year, Mt. Angel College changed its status from a women's college, to a co-educational school, offering both the B. A. and B.S. degrees. The first male student graduated in June, 1958. Several men are enrolled in the current summer session, and according to the admissions officer, about one-third of the freshmen expected in September will be men.

Registration dates for the fall session are September 12 and 13. The week of September 14 will be devoted to the completion of the freshmen testing, the orientation program and classes.

**RETURN FROM TRIP INTO CANADIAN WILDS**

Areas closed are limited in the main, to areas of recent unabated logging slash which becomes tinder dry during the summer. Suitable travel and fishing corridors are maintained wherever possible. Those persons having legitimate business in the closed areas may gain access by acquiring entry permits at the ranger stations having the closures. All roads and trails in the closures will be posted with prominent signs.

An area of particular interest this year is Clear Lake, which is being enlarged by the Bureau of Reclamation. Due to the large amount of accumulated clearing debris, this area is being closed for this summer only.

To date, the Mt. Hood forest has experienced only 15 fires, mostly lightning caused. All fires have been controlled at less than an acre.

Considerable spring moisture and late June rains contributed to the unusual lateness of the closures this year. They will remain in effect until the general fall rains begin.
