**NO COMMENT**  
By James W. Douhat  
Electing members of Congress  
is an obligation of citizenship  
that should be regarded with  
deepest concern, for ones never  
knows what transcendent prob-  
lems may develop in the years  
ahead.

Right now the problems await-  
ing action by the Senators and

that the next session of Congress  
is certain to be one of the most  
important in peacetime history.  
Because this is such a crucial pe-  
riod, congressional action will  
have an extraordinary effect on  
the nation's future—and also, in-  
evitably, on the future of the  
world.

It is for this reason that con-  
servative members of Congress-  
of both parties—are urging with

study of the campaign issues so  
that they will cast their ballots  
in the light of the nation's high-  
est welfare.

Why greater care than is cus-  
tomary should be exercised in  
selecting Senators and Repre-  
sentatives for the next Congress  
is explained clearly by one of  
the leading conservatives—Sen-  
ator Goldwater (R. Ariz.)

"I believe" he says "that the  
coming 86th Congress is faced  
with probably as great a chal-  
enge as any Congress of the Uni-  
ted States ever will be faced  
with—namely, to face up to its  
responsibilities to the American  
people in two general areas—  
first, the area of financial sound-  
ness and second, the area of pro-  
per labor legislation.

"To do this is going to require  
courage of a type that has not  
been too obvious in Washington  
for many years.

"It is very easy to swim with  
the stream, but it is hard to go  
against it; and the stream we are  
in today is not a healthy one for  
the United States.

"It is not healthy from a fi-  
nancial standpoint, because we  
are destroying the economic  
soundness of America; and it is  
not healthy from a moral stand-  
point when we allow government  
protection to the Becks, the Dlos,  
the Reuthers and the Hoffas to  
permit them to operate as they  
do in this country.

"Next year men are going to  
be called on to be men, and to  
stand up in Congress and vote,  
not with an eye toward perpetu-  
ating themselves in office, but  
with an eye toward perpetuating  
the American Constitutional Repub-  
lic, its freedoms, and our free  
enterprise system."

Many issues, of course, will be  
considered by the next Congress,  
including labor legislation, tax  
reform, government economy,  
and protection of state laws  
against federal preemption. In  
fact, virtually every issue before  
the 85th Congress is certain to  
reappear in some form before  
the 86th Congress—plus many  
more now being dreamed up by  
the New Fair Dealers.

A coalition of conservative Re-  
publicans and southern Demo-  
crats succeeded in the recent  
Congress in stopping some of the  
legislative proposals pushed by  
the New-Fair Dealers. But what  
will happen to this legislation in  
the next Congress if the ranks of  
labor-supported New-Fair Deal-  
ers are substantially increased?  
This question is causing real con-  
cern to the conservatives.

In the session of Congress that  
just ended, it was estimated that  
approximately 180 House mem-  
bers (a majority is 218) and 40  
Senators (a majority is 49) usu-  
ally could be counted on to sup-  
port labor's position on legisla-  
tion. As a result, researchers  
have been unable to find a single  
piece of legislation opposed by  
labor that has been passed dur-  
ing the two most recent sessions  
of Congress.

Organized labor now is waging  
an all-out campaign in an effort  
to obtain an actual majority of  
Senators and Representatives  
who will vote down the line for  
labor's legislative program.

Needless to say, the more New  
Fair Dealers there are in the  
next Congress the more likeli-  
hood there is of enactment of a  
major part—or all—of the AFL-  
CIO program.
