Promontory Park is a picnic area and campground provided by the Company as a public resort on the lake behind North Fork dam and will be opened to use in the spring of 1959.

The North Fork Hydroelectric Project is located on the Clackamas River five miles east of Estacada, Oregon, and approximately 35 road miles from Portland via the Clackamas River Road. The picnic park and campground is located approximately midway up the lake, which extends four and one-half miles upstream from the dam.

The Company proposes to make available for lease and operation by the concessionaire a suitable store building, residence, boat dock, and equipment storage building at the Park site. Store stock and fixtures, boats, motors and accessories are to be provided by the concessionaire.
