Two Outboard Motors Pun 50,000 Miles In 68 D.



NEW YORK, N. Y.—Setting completed the twice-around-the-a record unmatched in motor-boating history, two 60-horse-power outboard motors have just completed a 24-hour-a-day endurance run of 50,000 miles. The 68-day trial estimates the statement of the statement o day trial, certified by impartial officials of the U. S. Auto Club,

equalled twenty years of normal use by a boat owner.
