### Fire Committee Directors Meet

There was a very interesting meeting held on Dec. 9 by the Board of Directors of the Currinsville-Cazadero Rural Fire Protection District and the Fire Committee of the Estacada City Council. The Rural Board was represented by Harold Wooster, Delbert Kitching, Earl Brackett and Kenneth Palmateer, and the City Fire Committee by Chmn. Earl Eckersley and Councilmen Robert Clayville and Delbert Nordquist. Also in attendance were Mayor Robert Weinrich, Fire Chief Walter Sagner and Recorder Bob Cooke.

Mr. Loyal C. Lang, architect, presented and explained a preliminary drawing of an addition to the northwest corner of the city Hall building. This addition is requested by the Rural Fire Protection District Board for the purpose of housing a new piece of equipment recently purchased by the district.

Payment in full, including the heating and lighting, if and when built, will be paid for by the Currinsville-Cazadero Rural Fire Protection District, and they also will bear the cost of the architect and any fees for supervision.

### Second Generator of N. Fork on Line

The second turbo-generator at Portland General Electric company's North Fork dam on the Clackamas river spun into action Tuesday morning of last week bringing the new \$200,000,000 plant to its maximum capability of 53,000 kilowatts.

The number two unit went on line just 17 days after North Fork's first unit began producing commercial electricity on Nov. 22.

The completion of North Fork marks the addition of 198,000 kilowatts to the Northwest pool by PGE in the last 11 months.

Besides North Fork, the utility placed 120,000-kilowatt Pelton dam on line last January and added a 25,000 kilowatt generating unit to its Faraday powerhouse on the Clackamas early in November.

North Fork started full generation 27 months after the construction contract was signed between PGE and Guy F. Atkinson Co. of San Francisco on Sept. 14, 1956. The dam is a concrete structure reaching 910 feet across the Clackamas river canyon and standing 207 feet high.

Only major work left on the project is completion of \$3,500,000 fish passage facilities, which should be sometime around the first of the year.

### BARNARD HERFORD RANCH IN COMING SHOW AND SALE

Pendleton, Oregon, Dec. 10—Barnard Herford Ranch of Estacada, is among early entrants in the February 28 thru March 3, 1959 Columbia Empire Polled Hereford Association Show and Sale. The activity will be staged at Walla Walla, Wash.

Their entry consists of six pen bull entries—one pen of one; one pen of two and one pen of three. Largest Polled Hereford consignment sale ever staged in America, and probably the largest Polled Hereford show to be held anywhere in 1959, the Columbia Empire event is sponsored by Oregon, Idaho and Washington breeders.
