BANK AT SANDY MAKING IMPROVEMENT LOANS FOR FEDERAL AGENCY

The Clackamas County Bank has been approved to make FHA property improvement loans to home owners. The approval was contained in a letter sent recently to H. W. Berger, Executive vice president of the bank by Roy F. Cooke, assistant Commissioner of the Federal Housing Administration. Loans are available to all owners for remodeling, modernizing and repairing homes under this widely-used FHA Title I low cost budget plan. The moneys loaned for home

improvements under this program are from funds of the Clackamas County Bank at Sandy.

Any individual contractor or material supply dealer who wishes to participate in this home improvement program is invited to make application at the office of the institution.

The benefits of this program have been proven over the years. More than 21,000,000 families have obtained FHA loans to improve their properties. The total amount of money borrowed exceeds \$10 billion.

Homeowners can borrow up to \$3,500 for periods up to five years. All types of home improvements, such as remodeling, painting and decorating, insulating, plumbing and heating, wiring, cement work, grading, and landscaping, etc. (which adds life and value to the property) are eligible for FHA loans.

The Federal Housing Administration urges all homeowners to deal only with reputable established contractors or building supply dealers.

YOUR SOCIAL SECURITY

Q: I am 55 and lately received notice that I am eligible for disability insurance benefits. Can my daughter age 9 and her mother receive benefits as my dependents?

A: Yes, under the amended law of 1955 it is possible for both your wife and your daughter to receive payments.

Q: Are the payments to dependents of disabled workers automatic?

A: No, they should be applied for at the district office of the Social Security Administration.

Q: What is the first month for which the dependents' benefits are effective?

A: Payments to dependents of disabled workers will start with the payment for the month of September, 1958.

Q: I have heard that recent amendments to the Social Security Act provide benefits to dependents of disabled workers. I am 60 and currently receiving disability benefits. My wife is 56. We have no children. I should like to make application for my wife or have her file for monthly benefits. What is the procedure?

A: The 1958 Amendments do not provide payments to a disabled worker's wife under 62 who does not have a child entitled to benefits in her care. She will have to wait until she is at least 62 years of age.

Q: I was a steady employee at the telephone office until my health failed completely. My husband has been my dependent for years since as a lineman in 1935 he fell from a telephone pole. This year after due process I was advised that I am qualified as a disabled worker for disability insurance benefits under social security. I expect my first check in January. I am 54 years old. My question is this: Can my husband file for benefits as the dependent of a disabled wife? He is 65 now.

A: Yes. 1968 amendments to the social security law make it possible for your dependent husband who is 65 to receive benefits; however, application must be filed.

Q: As the wife of a disabled worker who is entitled to disability insurance benefits under social security, I am concerned because he does not want to ac-

cept vocational rehabilitation. He says there simply is no use to try. My husband and I have two small children. Is this a factor in dependent's benefits under the amendments? There was something in the newspaper about it.

A: Yes. Dependents' benefits are not payable if the disabled worker refuses, with out good cause, to accept vocational rehabilitation offered through the State Vocational Rehabilitation program.

Q: Where can eligible dependents of disabled workers file claim for benefits under provisions for the 1959 social security amendments?

A: At the nearest social security office, now.

Q: I am completely disabled, but am only 32 years old. There is no need for me to contact a social security office before I reach age 50, is there?

A: Yes, indeed. If you were in employment or self-employment

covered by the Social Security Act for at least 5 out of the 10 years before you became disabled and are now so severely disabled that you cannot work, you should apply for the disability freeze. Although you are too young to start drawing disability benefits now, your and your dependents' future benefit rights on the rights of your survivors in the event of your death will be protected if your social security record is frozen.

Q: I am receiving the maximum social security benefit of \$200 per month as a widow and for my three minor children. Will I therefore receive the maximum under the new law of \$254 per month for January 1959?

A: Not necessarily. The maximum family benefit that may be paid under the new law is determined by the average monthly earnings of your husband prior to his death. This increase may vary from a few dollars to the full amount of \$54.00.
