Increase Due In Social Security

Do you receive social security benefit checks? If your answer is 'Yes' it's now your turn to ask yourself questions like these: Since the 1958 Social Security Act Amendments have become law, how do they affect me? Will I get a higher benefit? How much will it be? When will it start? What do I have to do to get the raise? Should I get in touch with the social security office to make sure I won't be overlooked among the 12 million beneficiaries?

Here are the answers: Your benefit amount will be raised. The increases will average about 7 percent. Some will get slightly more than a 7 percent increase, while others will get somewhat less than that amount of increase. Present payments to retired workers aged 65 or over range from \$30 to 108.50. The new minimum and maximum rates for these beneficiaries will be \$33 and \$116. The present maximum of \$162.80 for a retired worker and wife will be raised to \$174. The most a family may receive at present is \$290 a month, but under the new law some families may receive as much as \$254.

Also beginning in 1959 social security taxes will be withheld on \$4800 of your earnings instead of \$4200, and the rate of tax will increase to 2 1/2 percent for each employee and employer while the self-employed will pay a tax of 3 3/4 percent.

The increase is effective January 1959. Checks for January are mailed to you early in February 1959.

What do you have to do to get the raise? NOTHING! It's all handled automatically. It's not necessary for you to get in touch with the social security office to get the increase.

That's the story! These amendments do affect you by increasing your benefit approximately 7 percent effective with the check for January 1959. No action on your part is required.

Forest Service Makes Three Sales

The Mt. Hood National Forest sold three sales on December 17. Supervisor Paul E. Neff advised. A total of 9,500,000 bd. ft. appraised at \$224,165 was auctioned off for \$347,165.00. The highest price paid for Douglas fir was \$43 per thousand bd. ft. Western hemlock brought as high as \$15.00.

The Fall Creek Sale of 1,800,000 bd. ft. appraised at \$30,150.00 was sold to A. H. Larsen Lumber Company of Estacada for \$73,800.00; Basalt sale of 200,000.00 bd. ft. appraised at \$60,320.00 was sold to Dwyer Lumber Company of Portland for \$75,365.00; Goose Lake sale of 5,700,000 bd. ft. appraised at \$133,695.00 was sold to Astoria Plywood Company of Astoria, Washington for \$198,000.00.

Three additional timber sales totaling 29,400,000 board feet are now being advertised for sale in January. This will complete the Mt. Hood National Forest 1958 timber sale program of 452,196,000 board feet of timber marketed.
