The committee said many pictures of wagon trains were taken in the 1850s and at least three photographers made extensive the plains and in the mountains.

It listed these photographers as J. Wesley Jones, who took 1500 pictures on the plains and in the mountains in the summer of 1851. All are missing.

J. M. Stanley, an artist as well as a Daguerrotype, who moved to the far west with the party of Gov. Isaac I. Stevens of the Washington territory. The committee said there is evidence that Stanley took a number of Daguerrotypes on the plains, but none has been found.

S. N. Carvalho, a Daguerrotypist from Baltimore, who went to California in the party of Col. John C. Fremont, leaving Missouri in September 1853 and crossing the mountains in mid winter. Carvalho took a large number of photographs, though the committee said

he exact number is not known. All the originals are missing, but the committee expressed belief that if they cannot be located, at least copies made in 1856 can be found.

BOY SCOUTS TO HELP IN GOODWILL INDUSTRIES DRIVE IN OREGON

Boy Scouts of the Portland Area Council and members of the Rotary Club of East Portland will join in the 8th annual Goodwill Good Turn Day Saturday, February 14th, according to an announcement today by Herbert Ambler, President of Goodwill Industries. The Good Turn drive is the collection of no longer needed clothing by Boy Scouts and Cub Scouts in a house to house campaign. The drive coincides with the Boy Scouts of America Anniversary Week, Ambler explained.

It is estimated that some 21,000 Cub and Boy Scouts will deliver special Good Turn bags to 190,000 homes in the area on Saturday, Feb. 7th. The same scouts will return one week later, Saturday, Feb. 14th, to pick up the filled bags in which the householders have put clothing, shoes, hats, etc. The collected clothing is delivered by the scouts to the nearest fire house. From there the materials are sent to Goodwill Industries on trucks volunteered by members of the East Side Rotary Club.

Continuing donations turned over to Goodwill Industries thru this yearly effort by the Boy Scouts give jobs to many handicapped men and women who might otherwise require public assistance from the state for their livelihood. Before these annual Good Turn collections began in 1952 Goodwill had less than 150 handicapped workers, many of whom were laid off during the seasonal slack-time layoffs.

The Good Turn Collection drive will be conducted in 12 counties of Oregon and Southern Washington. These include Multnomah, Clackamas, Washington, Yamhill, Tillamook, Clatsop, Columbia, Hood River and Wasco; and in the State of Washington in Clark, Klickitat and Skamania Counties.
