

YOUTH CONSERVATION CORPS WOULD AID OREGON SAYS NEUBERGER

Establishment of a Youth Conservation Corps to assist in preventing juvenile delinquency would help conserve both human and outdoor resources for the benefit of the nation, Senator Richard L. Neuberger said today. Neuberger is co-sponsoring a bill to create such an organization. The proposal provides for enrollment of young men between the ages of 15 and 22 for work on public lands under supervision of soil conservationists, forest rangers and wild life specialists. Purpose of the program is to

discourage juvenile delinquency by supplying constructive work opportunities for boys and young men whose abilities or inclinations do not indicate a professional career. Implementation of this idea will not cure juvenile delinquency, the Oregon Senator cautioned. It is a preventive measure. Neuberger pointed out that many juvenile court authorities and child guidance specialists have testified to the effectiveness of such experiments as the Civilian Conservation Corps of the 1930's in providing opportunity for young persons and rehabilitating juvenile offenders. Neuberger said that with its vast public lands Oregon would receive many direct advantages from the program. He said enrollees in the corps would receive many direct advantages from the program and could perform a variety of conservation and recreation tasks now left undone or inadequately staffed due to financial restrictions on existing agencies. Among projects cited by Neuberger as potential projects for Youth Conservation Corps members were construction of forest access roads and trails, improvement of young timber stands by

thinning, planting of seedlings on bare lands, stabilization of eroding stream banks by hand planting, building of picnic facilities, erection of earth dams to create upstream reservoirs, reseeding of deteriorated range lands, rebuilding of game cover; protection of fish and wild life areas.

Neuberger praised accomplishments of the original Civilian Conservation Corps and declared that similar useful achievements can be realized through a Youth Conservation Corps. He credited the CCC with planting 2 billion trees, terracing or otherwise protecting 25 million acres of land, improving or building 137,000 miles of trails and minor roads. Many of these worthwhile projects were carried out in Oregon, the Senator pointed out. He said our state was ninth in CCC expenditures and received allotments to over \$80,000,000.

Washington, D. C. —Want to get your taxes reduced? Then you might wish to learn about a bill just introduced in Congress to bring about basic reform of the tax system.

Among other things, it would reduce from 20 to 15 percent the personal income tax rate paid by those in the lowest bracket. It also would lower corporation income tax rates and all other personal income tax rates. The bill was introduced by two members of the tax-writing House Ways and Means Committee—Reps. Herlong (D. Fla.) and Baker (R. Tenn.)

Its supporters contend that it should receive immediate consideration by Congress because its enactment is essential to protect the nation's future.

Here in general is the reasoning behind the measure:

The present tax system stunts economic growth by limiting the supply of capital essential for starting new businesses and expanding those already established.

By removing tax blocks to progress, economic growth would be accelerated and a vital contribution made to the nation's economic progress and security.

This economic expansion would produce additional tax revenue which in the long run, would more than compensate for the amount lost by the tax revision program.

The Herlong-Baer bill is the 1959 version of the Sadlak-Herlong measure, which was supported by a majority of witnesses during tax hearings early last year before the House Ways and Means Committee.

The revised measure provides for a series of annual reductions in the personal and corporation income tax rates which would lower them, at the end of five years to a maximum of 47 percent.
