CARAMEL WHIRL CAKE STARTS THE DAY



Hot or cold, served early on a working morning or late on a Sunday, Caramel Whirl Coffee Cake makes a new and delicious day-starter. A really fresh twist on breakfast cakes, it's clever in shape, unusually rich in flavor, and very different in method. No measure, mix, or knead required—no rising time—just follow these speedy directions:

Caramel Whirl Coffee Cake

Open 1 can Quick Caramel Nut Rolls from the grocer's dairy case; cut dough into 8 slices. Crumble topping into small bowl. Unwind each slice and dip into 1/4 cup melted butter or margarine; then into crumbled topping. Twist a strip and wind into a coil in center of greased 9-inch round layer pan. Repeat with remaining strips, coiling them around first strip to fill pan, making one round flat coffee cake. Bake in moderate oven (375°) 20 to 25 minutes. Cool a few minutes before removing from pan. While warm, drizzle with a glaze of 1/2 cup confectioners' sugar and 1 to 2 teaspoons milk.

NO COMMENT

Washington D. C., Feb. 17—The newly-appointed Secretary of Commerce Lewis L. Strauss, enlisted in the battle for Government economy by sharply challenging the economic philosophy of those who preach the incredible doctrine that it is more blessed to be in debt than solvent.

He provided encouragement for the economy forces in Washington by pledging allegiance to this economic credo:

"I join with businessmen in saying: Keep our Government from spending beyond our means, give our free competitive enterprise its head, resist overloading it with unnecessary burdens—and our economy will grow, supplying our people with continual opportunities for betterment and personal well-being."

Not to follow this course, he believes, might lead to national disaster. As he put it:

"The cultivation of a habit of unbalanced budgets in the long cold war could so weaken our economy that it might not be

able to continue our great defense deterrent to war.

"For this deterrent must be constantly modernized as newer weapons and counter measures are invented. Continued national prosperity is essential to afford continued national defense."

"You will perform an urgent public service if you help public understanding of the need for a balanced budget and for reasonable price stability which is dependent upon it . . .

"Take a more active part in building public understanding of the widespread benefits to result if the budget is kept in balance, price stability maintained, the dollar protected, and healthy growth encouraged. Let your voice be heard."

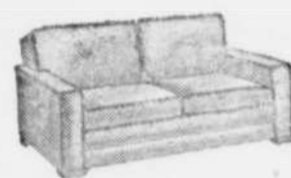
