### HORSEPOWER HORSE SENSE

This is actually harder on a car than the heavy use a delivery truck or taxicab gets. For example, condensation in the engine and exhaust systems will create acid or rust. When the car is driven on longer trips, with a hot engine, the condensation evaporates before it can do any damage.
