Indian War Veterans Meet

Answering to a call published in this paper last week, a number of veterans met at the courthouse last Saturday in the afternoon.

Table with columns: Name, Age, Came when, Where from. Lists names like J F Mulkey, J A Bounds, A I Nicklin, etc.

It will be observed that seven of those seventeen veterans were from Missouri, five were from Illinois, one each from the states of Virginia, Kentucky, Tennessee, Iowa and Arkansas.

It may also be noticed that the age of these old boys ranges from 51, to 78 years, and that one of them came to Oregon in 1846, and most of them came in 51, to 53. And all of them were here to take part in the Indian wars from 53 to 56.

The meeting then selected Capt Pleas Noland, Dr A I Nicklin and L B Rowland as delegates to represent the Lane county encampment at the meeting of the grand encampment to be held in Portland June 14, 1899.
