Mr. James Ebbert, of Springfield has just returned from looking afcountry, in Washington and Idahe, consisting mainly of landed property and loans on farms. Mr Ebbert informs us that he has not seen harder times among farmers there at present since '93-4. Wheat is only worth 36 cents net, and that but few will realize a profit on farm products. That the crops were not an average one the past season. Fruit was hardly half a crop. He gathered only 83 boxes from an orchard on his farm this season, from which he got 1400 boxes last year. Apples are worth 90 cents to \$1 to the box now. To show how things are running up there Mr. Ebbert says a farmer who owns a fine farm in Idaho was unable to pay him the annual interest on a mortgage Mr. Ebbert held against it.
