In France the We, the undersigned, citizens of the average salary of the prisoner is 35 cents Of this amount the prisoner is allowed to spend one-half while in prison for supplementary food and clothing, postage, etc., though no expenditure is made without the approval of the ad-ministration. The other half is reserved until the time of his discharge. A three years' prisoner has to his credit on leaving an average of \$50, a four years' prisoner \$70 and a five years' prisoner about \$90. - Chicago Record.
