A Chance to See Mercury.

The planet Mercury is rarely if ever een by the ordinary observer; it is never farther from the sun than 20% degrees and is, most of the time, too near the sun to be seen at all. The last week in this month and the first three or four days in May, constitute a rare opportunity. On the 26th inst. Mercury will be nearly I hour and 20 minutes behind the sun, and in addition to this it will be about 81/4 degrees farther north of the ecliptic which will delay its setting about 33 minutes. Thus while the sun will set on that day at about 7:00 p. m., Mercury instead of setting at about 8:20 will not reach the true horizon till about 8:53.

On the 20th of August next, Mercury will be about I hour and 40 minutes behind the sun, but will also be 111/2 degrees farther south toward the ecliptic and this will so accelerate the time of its setting that it will come to the horizon only about one hour later than the sun. Near the equator and in the southern hemisphere August 20 will be a very favorable time for seeing Mercury. On December 20th Mercury will be

about I hour and 26 minutes behind the sun and it will be but a trifle futher south, but its path will lie so low that any thing like a high hill will hide it scon after sunset. In general we may say that when Mercury is evening star in the spring it is in a favorable po for being seen, and vice versa wh morning star in the autumn it is in a good situation to view. Thus Octo 5th, it will be about 1% hours ahead of the sun, and nearly as far north, it will rise about 11/4 hours earlier than the s and its path will be about 20 de higher up than it will be in De thus rendering it less liable be shut e from view by any high object.

On June 15th, Mercury will be 1 and 35 minutes a head of the sun about 6 degrees farther north which will make it rise about 2 hours before the se but doubtless none will care to rise 2:15 a. m. just to see a star.
