A strong effort has been made, and will continue to be made, to cheat us out of our well earned victory by crowding into our ports all kinds of goods that are liable to be put under the guardianship of protection.

The Boston Globe reports that there has been already a great increase in the imports of wool on account of the expectation that the duty on wool will be reimposed, and states that more than 125,000 bales have been imported into Boston during the last month.

Mr. Henry Buxton has been circulating a petition, for the signatures of our people, the past week that means a great deal to the sugar industry of this coast.

"Free Trade" Wilson has been called to the presidency of Washington and Lee University, and has accepted. This is the same man who went across the ocean to be feasted and praised for the great amount of good he had done, not to his own America, but England by his free trade services.

Tony does not expect an office under the present administration, nor is his newspaper (it is understood that he does publish a newspaper somewhere in the state) prosperous enough to permit its owner to indulge in a pleasure journey.

This democratic relic is at the national capital on business—cash business. He is ably seconding the efforts of the lost "Charley" Ross and Constitutional McCamoy to have Corbett seated. Tony's duty lies with the democratic and populist members of the senate. He tells them if Corbett is seated, the governor will not call a special session, giving the next legislature to be elected the right to elect a senator. He tells them also that the "allied forces will control the next Oregon legislature; insuring a democratic or populist senator."

The Gold Reserve.

The jump of \$1,000,000 in the upward movement of the treasury gold reserve came this time quickly. Less than a week ago the \$152,000,000 mark was passed and now the \$153,000,000 line is crossed. The gold fund is up to the mark around which it stood most of the time during Arthur's and Cleveland's first administrations, and the first third of Harrison's.
